SBA Working Capital Loan Deadline is Approaching for Pennsylvania Businesses Affected by Tropical Storm Isaias

ATLANTA – The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding businesses in **Pennsylvania** that Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are still available to small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture, and private nonprofit organizations affected by Tropical Storm Isaias on Aug. 4, 2020. The application deadline is **Sept. 20.**

"Businesses that suffered economic losses as a result of the disaster and want to apply for low-interest loans from the SBA are urged to do so before the Sept. 20 deadline," said Kem Fleming, director of SBA Field Operations Center East.

The loans are available in the counties of Berks, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Montgomery, Philadelphia and Schuylkill in **Pennsylvania**; and Burlington, Camden and Gloucester in **New Jersey**.

The loan amount can be up to \$2 million with interest rates of **3** percent for small businesses and **2.75** percent for private nonprofit organizations, with terms up to 30 years. The SBA determines eligibility based on the size of the applicant, type of activity and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition. These working capital loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. The loans are not intended to replace lost sales or profits.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure website at <u>DisasterLoanAssistance.sba.gov/ela/s</u> and should apply under SBA declaration # 16816.

Loan applications can be downloaded from sba.gov/disaster. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **Sept. 20, 2021**.
